

To promote leadership qualities among children, village level Bal Panchayat (children's council) elections were held in 50 Bal Mitra Grams supported by Bal Ashram Trust. It is an inclusive democratic group of children which functions closely with the Gram Panchayat and local government bodies to make the villages child-friendly.





Education and Skill Development of children at Bal Ashram

Mental Health at Bal Ashram

We continued to support the mental wellbeing of children at Bal Ashram by providing 17 children online counseling sessions from the team of psychologists from Fortis hospital. The aim of these is to promote their self-regulation and emotional skills, by creating an environment of selfreflection.

Cricket is one of the most popular sports among all the children at the ashram. We are overjoyed to see children playing regularly on their new pitch constructed at Bal Ashram with the support of our valuable partners.

Building Systemic, Sustainable Change in the Communities

19 children were mainstreamed to the Government Schools from Banjara Education Centres. 21 new children from Banjara communities were enrolled in BECs in their age-appropriate learning grades. Total 319 children are studying in 10 BEC; out of them 56% are girls and 44 % are boys. We are proud as girls continue to outnumber boys in our Banjara Education Centres.



Community Development and Linkages with the Government Schemes



48 people were vaccinated against COVID-19 in Banjara villages with the support of primary health care workers.





4415 community
meetings were held each in 10
